

MULTIFAMILY DEVELOPMENT AND RENTAL HOUSING





For more than 40 years, the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency has been hard at work helping to fund the construction and rehabilitation of affordable rental housing across the Commonwealth. PHFA has a presence in every county of the state, leading the preservation and expansion of affordable housing options in rural and urban communities.

Along with using its own resources and other available funds, including the allocation of tax credits, PHFA works closely with developers; federal, state and local government agencies; and community and state organizations to coordinate the financing and construction of rental properties. These properties are critically needed for low- and moderate-income individuals and families, older adults, veterans, and people with disabilities.

The multifamily housing division funds and develops many types of properties including but not limited to:

- ▶ Historic building preservation
- ▶ Independent housing opportunities for older adults
- ▶ Properties designed specifically for disabled individuals
- ▶ Green-building and energy efficient developments

PaHousingSearch.com, our online search tool, helps you quickly and easily find rental housing in your area with the features you most desire like a certain number of bedrooms, proximity to a bus line, or handicapped accessibility. This online service is backed up by live phone operators who can assist you with your apartment search. PHFA leads a group of government and private partners that fund and oversee this service.
