



48 Rural Counties - Population Density Below Statewide Rate




# Five Demographic Trends Shaping Pennsylvania's Housing Market



## Rate of Change in Population by Decade, 1920 to 2050 (projected)









Statewide Population Change, 2020 to 2050 (Proj.) = 1.6%













Shaded counties have more people 65+ than people <20 years old










### Number of Youth and Senior Citizens in Pennsylvania, 1950 to 2050 (Projected)







### **Generational Cohorts in** Pennsylvania, 2020





Number of People of Color, 2000





## Number of Births and Deaths in Pennsylvania, 1990 to 2020






## Natural Population Change (Births Minus Deaths) by County, 2010 to 2019

#### Total Fertility Rate Replacement Level = 2.10+


Below Replacement Level

According to the CDC, the total fertility rate (TFR) estimates the number of births that a hypothetical group of women would have over their lifetimes, based on age-specific birth rates in a given year. Replacement level for the TFR is the level at which a given generation can exactly replace itself (generally considered to be 2.1 births per woman). Data sources: Pennsylvania Department of Health and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).




#### Net-Migration by State, 2020 to 2023





















### **#1: Fewer Youth Adults Becoming Homeowners**


Percent Householders Under 35 Years Old that are Homeowners



### #4: Aging Construction Workforce, 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter, 2000 to 2022





### **Forecasted Demand for Housing**

- Based on population projections through 2050.
- Used historical share of population living in households and projected number of persons per household to derive estimates.
- Primary variable was the population age <20.</li>
- Caveat: Does not reflect potential future trends in housing market (e.g., prices, interest rates, consumer preferences, fluctuations in property values).








Total Statewide Projected Growth in Demand for Housing = 5.2%


Projected Decline in Demand for Housing Projected Increase in Demand for Housing

### --Summary--5 Things to Remember



Pennsylvania is experiencing a period of population stagnation.



This is a long-term trend, and it is unlikely to change in the near term.



Pennsylvania's population is becoming older and more diverse.



Population decrease and aging population may cause housing demand to shift downwards in some counties.



Pennsylvania is not alone.
