

Waiver for Emergency Housing Relief Due to Federally Declared Disaster

Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency Waiver to the provisions of Section 42 pursuant to IRS Notice 2014-49 / 2014-50 to provide temporary housing or other assistance in accordance with the President's declaration of a major disaster.

Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency is permitting all owners of Low Income Housing Tax Credit properties in the State of Pennsylvania to provide temporary emergency housing to displaced individuals affected by Hurricane Florence, in accordance with Revenue Procedures 2014-49 and 2014-50.

Hurricane Florence received a Major Disaster Declaration on September 16, 2018 with FEMA incident period beginning on September 8, 2018 (**FEMA Disaster # DR-4394**).

Summary: Rev. Proc. 2014-49 allows for temporary relief from certain requirements of Section 42 of the IRS Code for owners of LIHTC buildings after the declaration of a Major Disaster by the President.

Rev. Proc. 2014-50 allows for temporary relief from certain requirements of Section 142 of the Internal Revenue Code for owners of bond/LIHTC projects.

Section 12 of Rev. Proc. 2014-49 and Section 6 of Rev. Proc. 2014-50 allow the owners of LIHTC properties to provide temporary housing for displaced individuals for a period of up to 12 months from the Major Disaster Declaration date; with approval from the state housing credit agency.

This notice serves as approval from the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency to all owners of LIHTC projects in Pennsylvania to provide Emergency Housing Relief to persons displaced by the federally declared disaster Hurricane Florence. The approved Temporary Housing Period ends September 30, 2019.

***Owners must retain a copy of this waiver in the project files; as it is subject to review by the IRS.**
